Guests who attended the party will receive a treasure map, a work of art in itself, which will steer them through Charleston visiting local merchants seeking “answers” to pre-determined “clues”. The hunt will end at the **Charleston Artist Guild Gallery** with a drawing for— what else! — priceless treasures.

The High School Artistic Merit Awards and Annual Scholarship competition, which is held at the Gaillard Auditorium, is open to all high school students in the tri-county area. Throughout the year, the guild members can be found at Charleston area senior citizens centers, St Matthew’s Summer Readiness program, and Pattison’s Academy Summer Camp. The guild is proud to bring their Art for Alzheimer’s program to local homes for the elderly.

The gallery is open Monday through Saturday 10 am to 5 pm and is located at 6 North Atlantic Wharf off East Bay Street and across from a convenient parking lot.
